Dear Sirs:

Present arrangement of remittance for monthly allotment and Special allotment of our seafarer the Bank of Philippine Islands (BPI) charges the allottee for transaction made. To avoid any penalty that will be imposed against us and to comply with Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA) Employment Contract Ventis will debit the principal bank charges for 1 allotment and Special Remittance for each crew per month as follows:

1. Monthly allotment = Php 50.00 (Standard Bank Charge of BPI)
2. Special Allotment = Php 50.00

Total = Php 100.00

Herewith the Standard Terms and Conditions Governing the Overseas Employment of Filipino Seafarers Onboard ocean going ships for your reference:

Section 8. ALLOTMENTS and REMITTANCES

- A. The Seafarer is required to make an allotment which shall be payable once a month to his designated allottee in the Philippines through any authorized Philippine Bank. The principal/employer/master/company shall provide the seafarer with facilities to do so at no expense to the seafarer. The allotment shall be at least eighty percent (80%) of the seafarer's monthly basic salary.
- B. The principal/employer/master/company may also provide facilities for the seafarer to remit any amount earned in excess of his allotment, including back wages, if any, to his designated allottee in the Philippines through any authorized Philippine Bank without any charge to him.
